

The Degree of Master of Māori and Indigenous Leadership (MMIL – 180 points)

These regulations must be read in conjunction with the General Regulations for the University.

1. Version

- (a) These Regulations came into force on 1 January 2022.
- (b) This degree was first offered in 2017.

2. Variations

In exceptional circumstances the Amo Matua, Toi Tangata | Executive Dean of Arts or delegate may approve a personal programme of study which does not conform to these regulations.

3. The structure of the Qualification

To qualify for the Master of Māori and Indigenous Leadership a student must be credited with a total of 180 points including:

- (a) TIRA430, TIRA431, TIRA679, TIRA680, TIRA495, and
- (b) TIRA404 or 30 points of 400-level coursework from the schedules of any postgraduate degree approved by the Tumuaki Kura | Head of School.

In exceptional circumstances a student may apply to the Amo Matua, Toi Tangata | Executive Dean of Arts or delegate for permission to replace TIRA679 with TIRA681.
